PROFESSIONAL SUMMARY:

I am a Scottish screenwriter with a background in Animation, VFX, and Product Design, bringing a visually inventive and technically confident approach to character-driven storytelling. My work focuses on thrillers and socially conscious dramas that challenge power, morality, and justice, often through a David vs Goliath lens. Since completing the Edinburgh Council Screenwriting Course in 2018, I have developed a strong portfolio of original short films, features, and television pilots. In 2025, I completed an MSc in Screenwriting at Edinburgh Napier University (ScreenSkills-accredited), where my work was noted for its ambition, emotional depth, and distinctive voice. I enjoy receiving and giving feedback, both positive and critical, and found peer reviewing to be an essential and rewarding part of the Masters experience. I aim to tell stories that blend realism with imagination, and that resonate with contemporary audiences through sharp dialogue, layered characters, and a fearless look at the systems shaping modern life.

BODY OF WORK:

A selection of original feature and television projects exploring morality, justice, and psychological tension.

 Beneath the Cassock : Feature, Psychological Thriller/Drama (Master's project, achieved a Distinction) A faithless, coke-addicted priest, stewing in a town clinging to doctrine, is forced to confront his past when the identical twin of the man he killed arrives - awakening ghostly visions of his victim and a spiral towards self-destruction.

- Lie Run Snitch: Feature, Crime Thriller / Family Drama

 After crossing a crew of violent loan sharks, a debt-ridden Scottish father flees

 Sheffield with his two daughters. But once they reach Edinburgh, he realises the
 only way to save them may be the one act guaranteed to get him killed snitching to the police.
- The Jax Project: Television Series, Crime/Political Thriller
 A Scottish ex-pat in America, accused of assassinating the President, faces off against a forensic psychologist whose probing sessions become a battle for truth, sanity, and identity.
- The Open Field: Television Series, Psychological Crime Drama

 After his girlfriend vanishes without a trace, a man with an anxiety disorder becomes the prime suspect in her disappearance, forcing him into a tense psychological duel with detectives determined to break him.
- **Steel**: *Television Series*, *Crime/Drama*When a cynical ex-thief, a grieving pensioner, a struggling engineer, a touchstarved therapist, and a battered drag performer are recruited for a government "ethical thievery" experiment, the line between justice and temptation blurs until their training turns deadly.
- Pace: Television Series, Legal/Drama
 When a young Black man is wrongfully charged with killing a police officer, a 91-year-old witness ignored by investigators sets out to expose the truth igniting a chain of moral reckonings that pits a disillusioned prosecutor against the system he serves.
- Scammers: Television Series, Thriller/Crime
 Two Scottish graduates move to Thailand for a dream job that turns out to be a cyber-fraud trap forcing one to catfish a lonely English tourist who may be her only way out.

FEEDBACK:

On Major Project: Beneath the Cassock

 Marker 1 Wrote: A spiritually rich and sincere reflection on guilt, culpability and penitence, with several engaging characters, some well-written monologues and some striking scenes and moments. There's an oblique sparring quality to some of the dialogue which reminds me of great crime fiction of both page and screen, and lots of deep emotion underpinning the drama.

The dialogue is often skilful and engaging – there's a choppy quality (in the screen directions too) that reminded me of crime writers like David Peace and James Ellroy.

• Marker 2 Wrote: This is a terrifically engaging read.
